- The Mayville State University Staff Senate met November 19, 2019.
- Our staff senate went over the HR 22 FMLA Policy update and submitted our position to Carla Freschette.
  For the purposes of HR22, Mayville State University does not support the changes that would allow for 40/80 hours of leave to be retained. Rather we would recommend and support a motion to make changes to NDUS HR Manual Policy 7 to allow for 1) an appeals process for employees under 7.7 for employees who disagree with their department head's decision and 2) To add an example list of events in which a person would automatically qualify to go negative in leave balance.
- We had a walkabout activity at our Staff Association Meeting in October. Results from that are being
  organized and discussed so that we as a Staff Senate can determine what ideas and activities we want to
  focus on. The goal is to work on things we can possibly make a difference with.

- Our newly formed committees are doing great work:
- Our Staff Recognition committee has developed a monthly Comet Kudos award to recognize staff
  members with outstanding contributions to the university. Each month, staff can nominate whoever
  they choose; there is a committee made up of staff, faculty, division chairs, and Cabinet members that
  make the final selection.
- Our Staff Professional Development Committee continues to hold monthly training sessions called "Staff Strategies." November's topic was "Travel and Expense." Staff had the opportunity to go over how to report per diem, mileage, airfare, taxi fares, and reimbursements.
- The Public Relations Committee has been putting out a monthly newsletter announcing current camps news, events, new hires, people leaving us, bdays, Comet Kudos winners, staff spotlights, etc. It has been very well-received by campus. They will be starting to focus on a Staff Senate presence on our Mayville State University website.
- Event Planning/Fundraising Committee has organized an office holiday decorating contest complete
  with a new "traveling trophy" that they hope to use for years to come. They are also currently
  organizing a Staff Holiday Potluck, where staff will bring a dish to share over lunch and are
  encouraged to wear their fun and festive holiday attire.
- In other news, our Staff Senate has adopted a 3-mile section of highway near our campus through the Adopt-A-Highway program. We are excited to start this project in the spring, and will be doing the cleanup about twice a year.

- NDSU's last Staff Senate meeting was held on November 6<sup>th</sup>.
- The Staff Development Committee hosted a "Dare to Lead" seminar led by Jill Nelson, faculty member from the NDSU School of Education. The session was well attended and feedback was positive.
- The focused charity drive for this month is canned tuna and fruit for the Emergency Food Pantry.

- NDSU's Senate Coordinating Council approved a new procedure for making policy changes. Prior to the new

  on the policy. Now unsigned policies will be returned to the responsible office after a designated period of
  time. The responsible office then can choose to modify or withdraw their proposed changes.
