- The Human Resources office presented to our monthly staff senate meeting with information about the annual open enrollment period for health, dental, and vision insurance (changes or new enrollments). Flex spending enrollment date is yet to be announced.
- The NDSU President's Council for Campus Well-Being (PCCW) is expanding their focus to include campus health and well-being. They aim to create a supportive environment, moving beyond the individual to the whole campus. Nine workgroups are in place to identify and work on tangible outcomes.
- Student Government has increased the number of senators to 21 to better represent all students across campus.
- HR Director John Woolsey talked about his first few weeks here. He talked about the performance review
  process and goals as an interactive process, with time allowed for feedback from employees. The HR
  newsletter will start again soon, and John announced a position to be posted soon for Asst. Director of
  Organizational Development.
- The Environmental Sustainability committee is working on education initiatives, and wrapping up a recent survey to gather info about awareness, etc. They are working on a newsletter to raise awareness and give ideas and tips.
- A budget and professional development committee has been formed, and they want to combine and/or share
  efforts across NDUS campuses either in person or by Skype/IVN. A survey of current efforts on each
  campus is being done.
- The 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary of NDSU Staff Senate approaches, and an event will be held in September, 2020.
- The president's cabinet has discussed concern over the impact of enrollment numbers on the budget. Changes to application process are being discussed, as well as the growing need for scholarship offerings.
