- Our "Discover U" staff development program is scheduled for March 6, 8:30-12:00 noon. It is free for all to attend and lunch will be served. The program will include an entertaining and interactive presentation by Dr. Charles Stoltenow who will cover topics from two different books

The Scholarship Comittee will also holding a book fair, March 2<sup>nd</sup>, at **Barnes and Nobel**. Money raised will be put toward future scholarships.

  activities to get in for free. This idea came from the conversations of staff vs. faculty emeritus and how the
