- The Staff Development Committee put on the 1st DiscoverU event of the 2019 school year. There was a good turnout of about 80 individuals. The presentation was very interactive with discussions and role-playing of different communication styles.
- The Environment Sustainability Committee held its first discussion panel that went well with 30 engaged participants. Main points about recycling: NDSU moved to all-in-one recycling, the white boxes for paper recycling can now include bottles and cans since it is no sort, and the student club started a tailgating recycling initiative which Teammakers caught on to so they now offer bags to tailgaters on game days so more things can be recycled. Proceeds from this recycling effort goes to student athlete scholarships. The committee would like to do a walk-through of the music building to see what more can be done there to promote recycling. This building was picked because it has been part of the waste audit the last few years so there would be data for comparison to see if efforts made by the committee are helping. The next panel will be held December 5th.
- Campus Space and Facilities Committee anticipates that parking fees will stay the same for the next year or two. There are plans for some of NDSU's parking lots to be updated in 2019, 2021, & 2022. NDUS selected Dunbar as a top priority building improvement and it was listed as number 2 on list submitted to Governor. Other facilities needing approval are the softball practice facility, a second expansion for University Village, and ND trade office will be moving out of Barry Hall so then an interactive classroom would hopefully replace that area.
- Discover NDSU is our largest event of the year for high school juniors and seniors. The day begins with a
 resource fair showcasing the programs and resources NDSU offers, followed by an admission presentation,
 student panel, and academic interest session. Optional specialty tours are also offered for the following
 areas: Residence Life, Engineering, the College of Business, and Architecture and Landscape Architecture
 facilities. Discover NDSU took place on October 18th & 19th, 2018.
