- This past year BSC established an Employee Engagement Team on campus to provide recommendations to the BSC Cabinet on how to improve employee morale/engagement on campus. BSC's first effort is, and will continue to be, prioritizing pay raises and preserving the State's current health care plan. The next big move has started with BSC piloting a change to the public hours for the 2018 Fall semester, based off of recommendations provided by the Employee Engagement team. The new public hours for 2018 Fall are 8am-4pm. Throughout the pilot, BSC will review department feedback, public concerns and etc. In December, a determination will be made whether to continue the new public hours. NDUS/BSC policy requires employees work 40 hours per week, but this change allows for increased opportunities for flexible schedules for more BSC employees, including public facing departments.
- The Staff Senate Employee Outreach Committee received approval for BSC employees to wear their BSC Mystic Apparel for home game days. This is just one activity they are working on for the upcoming year to help increase employee morale around campus.
- We elected a new Vice President for our Staff Senate committee. Thank you Ashley Mattson for accepting the nomination!
- BSC held their annual Meadowlark picnic which is open to all BSC employees.

Staff Senate is organizing a special tribute to Braxton Raymond, a one-time WSC student athlete. Braxton has been slowly losing control of his muscle movement since October of 2017. He had gone through a number of different medical professionals who could not find anything physically wrong with him. Upon arrival home after two semesters at Williston State College, Braxton lost feeling in his left hand and left foot. Throughout the summer Braxton was tested for a wide array of things looking for the exact medical diagnosis. On August 17<sup>th</sup>, 2018 Braxton was diagnosed with a brain tumor. The brain tumor is located on the right side of his brain and is considered inoperable. He has lost mostly all control of left side of his body which has affected his ability to walk (he is using a walker now), speak (he will start meeting with a speech pathologist this week), and take care of himself. They estimate Braxton has 2-5 years to fight the tumor and hope for further medical advances in that window to help in his fight. He has been going through radiation and chemo to attack the tumor. He is also doing rehab to gain strength back in his left side. Details on our staff tribute to Braxton are forthcoming!
